2016 Study Guide

Questions will be taken from the following areas Horseless Horse Book, General 4-H Equine Rules, 4-H Horse Project Rules, 4-H Horse Helmet Policy, 4-H Horse Lease Guide, Uniform Rule Book and Project Books.

(These are only suggested pages to study. Please review entire book.)

1. Parts of the Horse – Understand how to identify the parts of the horse correctly.
2. Horse Conformation – Know how to properly identify different forms of conformation.
3. Hoof Identification – When viewing the hoof bottom, know how to label the anatomy appropriately.
4. 4-H Horse Policies, Rules, and Forms – Be sure to go over and know policy rules, 4-H rules, and forms that are used by the State and County 4-H.
5. Feed Samples – Know how to identify different feed stuff by color, texture, etc.
6. Project Book, Showmanship, and Safety – The key to this is to know your project book. All 4-H Members have different project books so this is not general. It deals with YOUR book that should have been worked on already this year. General Showmanship knowledge will also be tested.
7. Horse Breeds – It is important to know all breeds regardless of what riding style you are accustomed to. Know popular breeds, but understand differences in the breeds as well.
8. General 4-H Information – (i.e., Record/Book Completion) Bring Completed-to-date project books, 4-H Pledge, motto, colors and meaning, who, when & where 4-H was founded. What the 4-H's stand for, Names of County 4-H Extension Educators, what university Ohio 4-H is associated with, general 4-H member rules and Horse Guidelines, your 4-H Club name, your Advisor's name, where does Scioto County hold 4-H camp, and project requirements. **This information can be found throughout our OSU Extension website @ scioto.osu.edu**
